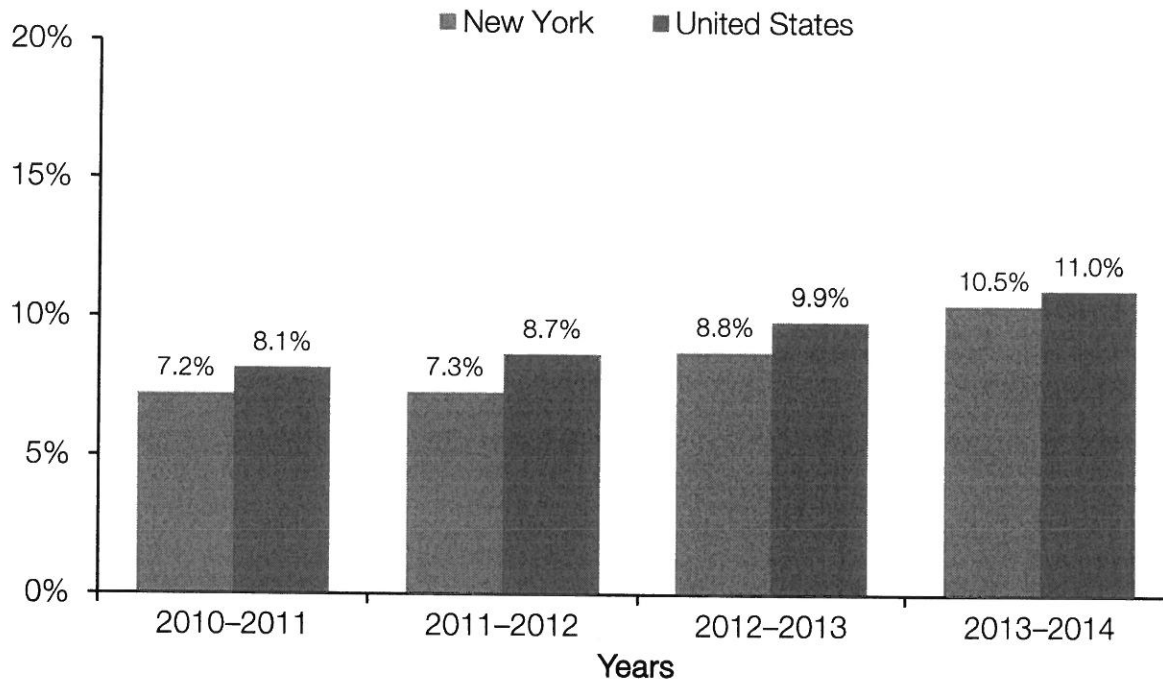

Past Year Major Depressive Episode (MDE) Among Adolescents Aged 12–17 in New York and the United States (2010–2011 to 2013–2014)^{1,4}

New York's percentage of major depressive episode (MDE) among adolescents aged 12–17 was similar to the national percentage in 2013–2014.

In New York, about 151,000 adolescents aged 12–17 (10.5% of all adolescents) per year in 2013–2014 had at least one MDE within the year prior to being surveyed. The percentage increased from 2010–2011 to 2013–2014.

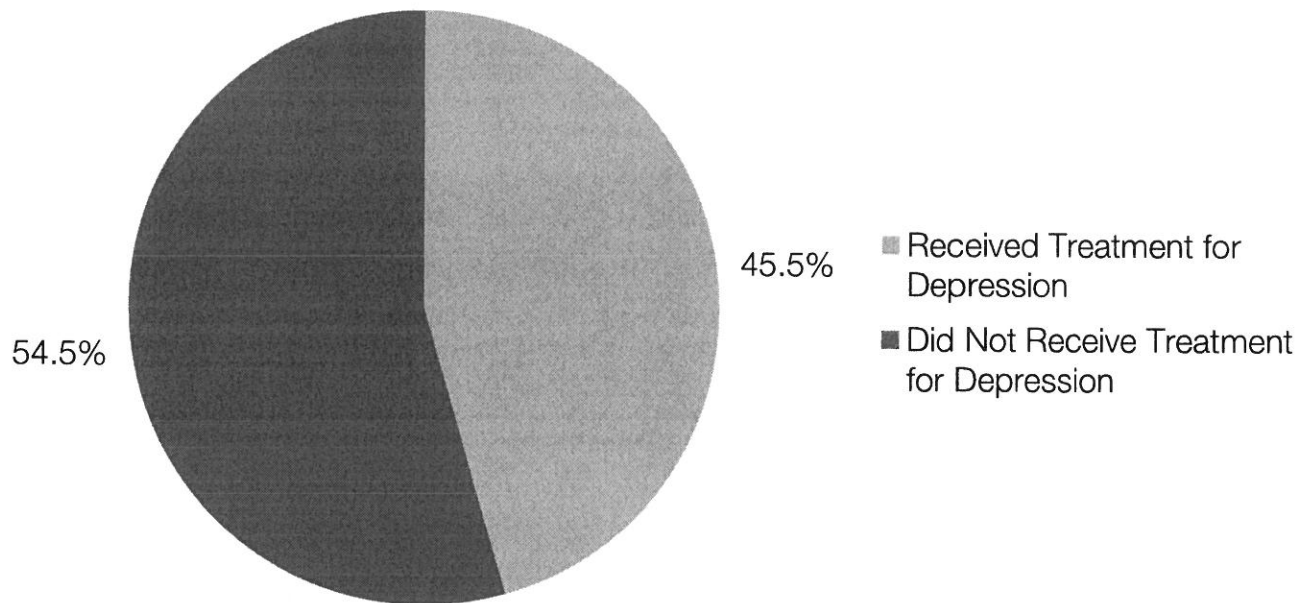

Past Year Treatment for Depression Among Adolescents Aged 12–17 with Major Depressive Episode (MDE) in New York (Annual Average, 2010–2014)^{2,5}

New York's annual average of treatment for depression among adolescents aged 12–17 with MDE was higher than the annual average for the nation (38.6%) from 2010 to 2014.

In New York, about 53,000 adolescents aged 12–17 with MDE (45.5% of all adolescents with MDE) per year from 2010 to 2014 received treatment for their depression within the year prior to being surveyed.
